Introduction

- Purpose and target audience
- BIA support biotrade (and bioprospecting) along ethical and sustainable standards
- To contribute to biodiversity conservation and local development
- Compliance with ABS legally binding
- But: biotrade (often) more comprehensive
 -> additional criteria for ethical practices for BIA support
 - based on voluntary commitments of private sector
- Use of UNCTAD BioTrade Principles as internationally acknowledged reference
- Commitment as prerequisite for BIA partnership support (call for Eol)



What is BioTrade?



- UNCTAD launched BioTrade Initiative in 1996
- Promoting sustainable use of biodiversity in line with CBD and other international policy objectives
- Activities of collection, production, transformation, and commercialization of products & services derived from biodiversity under the criteria of environmental, social and economic sustainability
- UNCTAD BioTrade Principles and Criteria, used as basis for policies, projects and guidelines in sectors from ecotourism and personal care to handicrafts and ornamental flora

- UEBT created in 2007 with support of UNCTAD BioTrade Initiative.
- Members commitment and gradual implementation of UEBT standard.

- Sustainable management plans, plus good agricultural practices, energy consumption, waste management etc.
- Partnerships, fair prices, work towards living income, contribution to local development
- Compliance with ABS requirements
- Respect for human rights and international principles in CBD, CITES, UNDRIP, among others
- Worker rights and good working conditions
- Systems for traceability and good practices



Ethical sourcing system

Elements

- Assessment of portfolio on ethical sourcing risks
- Ethical sourcing commitments
- Due diligence system for natural ingredients
- Due diligence system for ABS
- Promote sourcing with respect in priority supply chains




Good practices on ABS

- Identifying raw materials, products and activities involved
- Collecting information from suppliers
- Monitoring legal developments
- Raising awareness among employees, suppliers and clients
- Establishing strategies, procedures and policies for compliance
- Coordinate compliance with broader approaches and commitments
- Negotiating permits and agreements
