- Crops: cowpea, amadumbe, amaranth, cassava, Bambara nuts, pearl millet



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## **Implementation challenges**

- Less investment in IFC research
- Less prioritised
- High seed demand
- Language barrier (developed material)
- Lack of formal training
- Lack of farmers' database



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## Lessons learned .....

- Need for seed production schemes
- Buy-in from politicians
- Align DALRRD's research priorities with the research institutions
- Translation of developed material
- Value adding and product development
- Promotion of collaboration
